

A Moment in Black History

June 07, 1966 – New York Senator Robert F. Kennedy became one of the first major American Politicians to take a public stand against South African Apartheid when he delivered an address to the National Union of South African Students in New York City.

June 25, 1773 –Massachusetts slaves petitioned the state legislature for freedom. A bill was drawn and passed by the Mass. Legislature. But the governor withheld approval and the measure never became law.




In 1979 the state of Texas officially declared Juneteenth as a state holiday. Texas was the very first state to recognize Juneteenth as a significant date. However, this recognition was merely 114 years in the making. As such, Juneteenth joined the list of holidays to commemorate African American History.

Juneteenth or June 19th 1865, is the official date that the people of Texas were informed that all slaves were free based on the Emancipation Proclamation. Unfortunately for slaves in Texas, this news was delivered 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ years after President Lincoln signed the Emancipation Proclamation, thus adding insult to injury.

During early Juneteeenth celebrations, participants would listen to readings of the Emancipation Proclamation, listen to sermons, play various games, and enjoy traditional foods including pit barbeque. Today's Native American Texans return home in large numbers for Juneteenth celebrations.

As of today 41 states, and the District of Columbia have officially recognized Juneteenth as a statewide holiday.



Faith of Our Fathers



June is the month that we celebrate fathers. Every third Sunday is Father's Day where many fathers receive gifts, hugs and quality time with those who esteem them. Typically, in America, Father's Day can't compare with gifts and advertisement of Mother's Day but from a biblical perspective, fathers have a major role.

In Old Testament time, fathers not only helped with rearing and instructing the children but taught the sons a trade, helped in finding a wife for their sons (Genesis 24:4) and set a standard for the sons on manhood and an example of a husband to his daughters. Although times have changed, qualities and responsibilities are essential and a need for now.

The book of Proverbs has several one-way conversations of Solomon instructing his sons on manhood and life.
