A Moment in Black History

August 28, 1963 – I Have A Dream. Martin Luther king Jr. gave his I Have A Dream speech at the Lincoln memorial, 1963.

August 22, 1844 – Blacks declares segregation a violation. A mass meeting of blacks in Boston adopted a resolution declaring that segregated public schools in that city violated the State constitution. Their request was denied.

August 22, 1996 – President Bill Clinton signed the Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Act which ushered in the most sweeping changes in the welfare system since its adoption as part of the Social Security Act of 1935.
