Focusing on Prayer

"Pray without ceasing." - 1 Thessalonians 5:17

The month of September is the 9th month of the year but I consider it the start of another year of the relationship with First Baptist Church and I as pastor. You often hear in the closing of the robocalls you get from me saying, "Let's continue to lift each other up....". This lifting up is focused on praying for one another. We can remember the song of the church, "Somebody prayed for me; had me on their mind; took the time and prayed for me. I'm so glad they prayed for me".

As the seasons change in our life, like the actual seasons change, praying may become difficult. Distractions, deceptions, disappointments can cloud our lives and we need assistance. Here are a couple things that I discovered in an article from Chuck Lawless that may help us breakthrough a time when praying is challenging.

- 1. **Ask someone else to pray** *with you* **daily.** Enlist that person, and then ask him or her to lead the prayer on your behalf. Praying with someone is a step in the right direction, and you don't have to be the one verbalizing the prayer.
- 2. **Start** *somewhere*; **do** *something*. Even if you pray a one-sentence prayer during the day, that's better than not praying at all. It's not where you should want to land, but it's a start. The fire will grow, even if it takes a while.
- 3. **Meet with someone you believe prays well, and ask questions about prayer.** If you spend intentional time with a prayer warrior, you'll likely learn that he or she, too, has had dry spells in the past. Then, listen and learn about ways to grow in prayer.
- 4. **Read the Lord's Model prayer aloud several times throughout the day.** Using either Matthew 6:9-13 or Luke 11:2-4, follow the Lord's teaching to pray. Don't let the prayer become formulaic, but use it to "jump start" your prayer life.
