What is Easter?



Easter is a Christian holiday that celebrates the belief in the resurrection of Jesus Christ. In the New Testament of the Bible, the event is said to have occurred three days after Jesus was crucified by the Romans and died in roughly 30 A.D. The holiday concludes the "Passion of Christ," a series of events and holidays that begins with Lent—a 40-day period of fasting, prayer and sacrifice—and ends with Holy Week, which includes Holy Thursday (the celebration of Jesus' Last Supper with his 12 Apostles, also known as "Maundy Thursday"), Good Friday (on which Jesus' crucifixion is observed) and Easter Sunday.

Although a holiday of high religious significance in the Christian faith, many traditions associated with Easter date back to pre-Christian, pagan times. Easter Sunday and related celebrations, such as Ash Wednesday and Palm Sunday, are considered "moveable feasts," although, in western Christianity, which follows the Gregorian calendar, Easter always falls on a Sunday between March 22 and April 25. Easter typically falls on the first Sunday after the first full moon occurring on or after the spring equinox.

A Moment in Black History

April 15, 1959 – African Freedom Day is declared at the All-African People's Conference in Accra, Ghana.

April 3, 1944 -The US Supreme Court, in an 8-1 ruling declared that Blacks could not be barred from voting in the Texas Democratic primaries. The high court repudiated the contention that political parties are private associations and held that discrimination against Blacks violated the 15th Amendment.

Preparing For Easter

As Easter approaches this month, we may need to be reminded of the importance of the season and this victorious day. Many people in the world and even in the church tend to give greater emphasis to Christmas because of the commercial "gift-giving" that comes along with the day. Celebrating the birth of Jesus Christ is a significant day to reflect **on how the Saviour came** but Easter has a greater weight of importance because it focuses **on why the Saviour came**.

The Apostle Paul shared to the Corinthians the importance of the resurrection of Christ. He says, "And if Christ be not risen, then is our preaching vain, and your faith is also vain. Yea, and we are found false witnesses of God; because we have testified of God that he raised up Christ: who he raised not up, if so be that the dead rise not." (1 Cor. 15:14-15). As children of God, we believe and confess with our heart and mouth that Jesus is Lord and that God has raised him from the dead. That's the faith that we live by.

Easter or Resurrection Sunday is the most celebrated day by the Church because "He Arose". Whether individuals where new clothes in awareness of a new life or out of a commercial tradition, the worship should be celebratory of God's love and grace shown to His children.

As the day approaches, let this time be a time of reflection, repentance and rededication. **Reflection** of what was done and how Jesus responds during the Passion Week; **Repentance**; as God shows us our sins, let us confess and be cleansed through our confession; **Rededication** of our commitment to God, to ministry and one another.
