Learning Knows No Bounds

I would like to offer words of encouragement for our students in Elementary school, middle school, high school and college. Heavenly father in the name of Jesus, I affirm your word over our children that tell them in Isaiah 54:13 that children shall be taught by the lord and great shall be the peace of my children. I want to offer encouragement to children who are facing difficult challenges and changes such as covid-19, systematic hatred and racism, social distancing and virtual learning. I especially want to encourage students dealing with virtual learning. As a former teacher I recognize that all students learn differently. For example, some are visual learners; that can grasp it virtually, some are auditory learners; where they hear it once or twice and they got it, some are kinesthetic and tactile learning where hands on and movement is a way for students to grasp information.

Listening and speaking to some students from elementary, middle and high schools, I was given feedback about virtual learning. The elementary children I spoke with thought it was fun interacting with their teachers on laptops. However, they sometimes got distracted and got a little bored. The middle school student I spoke with didn't really like virtual learning, because there was no fellowship, in other words no socializing. There was a tendency to want to play. Sometimes didn't understand, but it got easier once the teacher walked them through the lessons. The high schooler I spoke with complained about slow WIFI and students goofing off. Student said rather tell the online instructor that they didn't understand, the respectfully remained quiet, because of their peers. Also the high schooler is one of those learners I spoke about. She is a hand on visual learner. She stated that she would much rather have the papers right in front of her, instead of trying to find it on the computer, then also miss what the teacher may have said. She spoke about some disruptions in the virtual classrooms. Such as, students playing, lagging WIFI connections and not being able to focus. The college student didn't complain about virtual learning, but was worried about covid-19 in colleges.

So basically I just want to tell the youth, high schoolers, and college age children, to Fear Not saith the Lord, Be of good courage, yea I will help you. I encourage you to continue to stay safe, wash your hands frequently, wear your face mask often and do your best. Your Daddy God knows all about it and he too shall supply all your needs!
