Reverend Amy Lee Goodman Grant was born April 14, 1941 to Evangelist Moses Goodman and Christine Allen-Goodman in Fairmont NC. She graduated from Rosenwald High School in 1959 and moved to New York City immediately after her graduation.

Reverend Grant, honoring her Christian roots quickly joined and became an active member of Lowly Nazarine Baptist Church located in the Bronx NY. She was a member of the choir, the missionary board and in 1983 presented her first sermon and was licensed as a Minister. Reverend Grant lived in New York until 1985. She moved to Winton North Carolina and later to Hampton, Virginia, where she was ordained as a Reverend at First Baptist Church East End in Newport News Virginia. Reverend Grant lived in Hampton before returning home to Lumberton, North Carolina in 2010. She joined First Baptist Church in 2012 and currently serves as an Associate Pastor, a Sunday School Teacher, a member of the missionary board, and the Women's Auxiliary.

Reverend Grant is the proud mother of three daughters, Chandler Goodman, Valerie Comrie, and Teresa Grant, She has 13 grandchildren and 22 great-grandchildren. She was married to Ronnie Lee Vann, the father of her daughters who passed in 1984 and to Roy Lee Grant who passed away in 2002.

Martin Luther King, Jr. Day is a federal holiday in the United States making the birthday of Martin Luther King, Jr. It is observed on the third Monday of January each year. King's birthday is January 15. The holiday is similar to holidays set under the Uniform Monday Holiday act. Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. was a vital figure of the modern era and pivotal figure in the Civil Rights Movement. His sermons, lectures, and dialogues stirred the concern and sparked the conscience of a generation. His charismatic leadership inspired men and women, young and old, in this nation and around the world. Rev. Dr. King, Jr., at the age of 19 entered the Christian ministry and was ordained at Ebenezer Baptist Church in Atlanta, GA. In 1954, upon completion of graduate studies at Boston University, he accepted a call to serve at the Dexter Avenue Baptist Church in Montgomery, AL. While there he was an instrumental leader in the Montgomery Bus Boycott made famous by the nonviolent resistance and arrest of Rosa Parks. He resigned this position in 1959 and moved back to Atlanta to direct the activities of the Southern Christian Leadership Conference. From 1960 until his death in 1968, he served as co-pastor with his father at Ebenezer Baptist Church. Martin Luther King, Jr. was shot while standing on the balcony of the Lorraine Motel in Memphis, TN and died on April 4, 1968.
