A Moment in Black History

February 1, 1926 – What is now know as Black History Month, was first celebrated on this date as Negro History week by Carter G. Woodson. It became a month long celebration in 1976.

February 15, 1851 – Robert Morris became one of the first black lawyers in United States after being admitted to the Massachusetts bar in 1847. By the early 1850s, Robert Morris was appointed a justice of the peace and was admitted to practice before U.S. district courts.

February 12, 1909 – Founded in 1909 in New York City by a group of black and white citizens committed to social justice, the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP) is the nation's largest and strongest civil rights organization.

Dear Members & Friends


As FBC continues to take necessary precautions for in-person worship, the COVID Ministry feel the need to continually provide you with updated information. We are still restricting a maximum capacity of 75 for in-person worship.

We continue to take measures in keeping all areas of use sanitized with a recommended disinfection solution.

Your continued cooperation with our staff members, ushers, volunteers etc. is appreciated.

Reminders: For your safety and the safety of others, we ask that you cover your mouth and nose when coughing. COVID-19 prevention steps include wearing a mask during in-person worship, physical distancing of 6' and hand washing. For your convenience, a hand sanitizing station located in the vestibule as you enter the building. Temperature checks for all worshippers and log in of names for contact tracing remain a requirement.

If you or family member (s) experience consistent coughs and/or a fever of 100.4% or higher, or If you knowingly have been exposed to someone with COVID, please stay at home and self-quarantine according to CDC guidelines and/or contact your doctor, if you feel the need to do so. Of note, people can have the virus and spread COVID without having a fever. Black History Facts

- The celebration of Black History Month began as "Negro History Week" which was created in 1926 by Carter Woodson, a noted African American historian, scholar, educator and publisher. It became a month-long celebration in 1976.
- NAACP- Spurred by growing racial violence in the early 20th century, and particularly by 1908 race riots in Springfield, Illinois, a group of African American leaders joined together to form a new permanent civil rights organization, the National Association for advancement of Colored People(NAACP).
- **Eminent Scientist** George Washington Carver developed 300 derivative products from peanuts among then cheese, milk, coffee, flour, ink, dyes, plastic, wood stains, soap, linoleum, medicinal oils, and cosmetics
- **First Senator** Hiram Rhodes Revels was the first African American ever elected to the U.S. Senate. He represented the state of Mississippi from February 1870 to March 1871.
- **First Woman Representative** Shirley Chisholm was the first African American woman elected to the House of Representatives. She was elected in 1968 and represented the state of New York. She broke ground again four years later in 1972 when she was the first major party African American candidate and the first African American candidate for president of the United States.
- **Self Made Millionaire** Madam C. J. Walker was born on a cotton plantation in Louisiana and became wealthy after inventing a line of African American hair care products. She established Madame C. J. Walker Laboratories and was also known for her philanthropy.
- **First Professional Black Baseball Player** On April 5, 1947 Jackie Robinson became the first African American to play Major league baseball when he joined the Brooklyn Dodgers. He was name Rookie of the Year.
- **First Black Billionaire** Robert Johnson became the first African American billionaire when he sold the cable station he founded, Black Entertainment Television (BET).
- First Black President- In 2008, Barack Obama became the first black President of the United States.
- **Heavyweight Champ-** Jack Johnson became the first African American man to hold the world heavyweight champion boxing title in 1908. He held onto the belt until 1915.
- First Lawyer- John Mercer Langston was the first black man to become a lawyer when he passed the bar
