A Moment in Black History

June 19, 2021- Juneteenth is a holiday that commemorates the day in 1865 when enslaved people in Galveston, Texas learned they were free, more than two years after the Emancipation Proclamation was signed. The word "Juneteenth" is a portmanteau of the words "June" and "Nineteenth". In 2021, Juneteenth became an official federal holiday.

June 2, 1899 - Black Americans observed day of fasting called by National Afro-American Council to protest lynching and racial massacres.

June 15, 1864 - Congress passed bill equalizing pay, arms, equipment and medical services of Black troops.

The first time Father's Day was held in June was in 1910. Father's Day was officially recognized as a holiday in 1972 by President Nixon. 
