

July 5, 1827 – In 1827 Rev. Nathaniel Paul, a minister in Albany, New York, hails the final abolition of slavery in that state. His address given on July 5, 1827 in Albany marks that occasion.

Group Implementation

As the Church continues to evolve, there are at least two things that we can hold true to. One is that *"the gates of hell shall not prevail against it"* (Matt. 16:17b). The second is that change is certain and necessary. We have progressed in our households from outhouses to indoor bathrooms, landline phones to cell phones, and wood-burning stoves to digital appliances. At First Baptist, we have TV monitors, displaying scriptures, hymns and any needed information, SimpleChurch app that helps members give and stay connected, plus we stream on three different platforms a Sunday. Like our homes, these changes help improve the quality of life and help us to do things easier. The changes we have at First Baptist help us serve one another as well as visitors and the community.

One of the latest changes in ministry is the involvement of groups. Groups consist of some of the committees and teams, we already have in place like Sunday School classes and missionary circles, but also extend to specific areas i.e., Singles ministry, Couples Ministry, Bereavement ministry, etc. This will allow greater growth from everyone as certain areas in their life are addressed and ministered to. While I believe that as a pastor, I can make an impact in someone's life, the impact of a group is much more sustainable and reproducible. From a blog shared in August 2016, Eric Geiger gives 3 reasons groups can impact our church.

1 – A group provides encouragement that no one person will ever be able to provide. We are all limited in the number of relationships we can have. Thus, a church that does not value group acts as they foolishly believe that a pastor/leader can deeply relate to a lot of people. Without groups, ministry leaders can run feverishly in futile attempts to relate deeply to lots of people. 2 – A group illustrates the faith in multiple ways. One person can provide an incredible example of faith and godliness, but it is *one* example. A group of people provide multiple expressions and illustrations of how the Christian faith is expressed in different spheres of life.

3 – A group of believers provides a counter culture. People in your church are going to be impacted by some group of people. The wisdom writer wrote, "The one who walks with the wise will become wise, but a companion of fools will suffer harm" (Proverbs 13:20). The groups of people we surround ourselves with either help or harm us. By offering and emphasizing groups, churches offer an opportunity to walk with the wise. If people don't walk with the wise, they will be a companion of fools and suffer harm. My prayer is that the implementation of group ministries will help address the whole man and empower us the more to be **Committed To Serving Others**
