A Moment in Black History

September 03, 1868 – African Methodist Episcopal minister and later Bishop Henry McNeal Turner emerged immediately after the Civil War as one of the most ardent defenders of African American right. Turner was also among the first group of reconstruction era African American elected officials.

September 09, 1915 – The father of Black history Carter G. Woodson founds the association for study of Negro life and history.

September 11, 1740 – An issue of the Pennsylvania Gazette reports on a cc Negro named Simon who reportedly can "bleed and draw teeth." It is the first mention of an African American doctor or dentist in the colonies.

Jesus Joy

For the month of September, we will begin our bible study in Paul's letter to the Philippians. Here we discover many verses that we have quoted as verses of affirmation of victory and our faith. Verses like, "That at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, of things in heaven, and things in earth, and things under the earth; And that every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father" (Philippians 2:10-11), or "I can do all things through Christ which strengtheneth me" (Philippians 4:13 or "But my God shall supply all your need according to his riches in glory by Christ Jesus." (Philippians 4:19). Verses along with this entire letter were written by Paul from prison. His imprisonment was likening to what we would consider house arrest. He was shackled to a Roman guard every hour of every day for approximately 2 years.

Instead of a letter of pity, doom and gloom, the apostle wrote this epistle that brought encouragement to the saints in Philippi. Paul exhibited a joy that was not based off of his current situation and condition. Having "Jesus Joy" gave the apostle a different perspective of his present state. He saw being chained to a roman guard as an opportunity to witness and preach the gospel daily. He saw his imprisonment as a platform to reach by letter a message to give other believers hope.

When we walk in Jesus Joy, we are able to see things not by sight bur rather by faith. We know that Good Friday looked terrible because Jesus died on the cross but by faith, we know that his death brought us life, eternal life; life abundantly. So, as we continue to navigate through this pandemic and any trial that may come, let's "Rejoice in the Lord always: and again, I say, Rejoice." (Philippians 4:4). We, like Paul can be encouraged to encourage others because the joy of the Lord is our strength.

Thanks to the Most High God for allowing me to serve in this part of the vineyard called First Baptist Lumberton these past three years. I thank Him for giving me loving parents and a loving family and church family to grow in the knowledge of God. I'm thankful for having a legacy of great men who served as pastor before me.
